Gudmundur Alfredsson is an Icelandic lawyer (MCJ – NYU '76, SJD – Harvard Law School '82). He has served as Professor of International Law and Human Rights at universities in Akureyri, Beijing, Lund, Riga, Strasbourg and Washington DC. He was Director of the Raoul Wallenberg Institute of Human Rights and Humanitarian Law in Lund (1995-2006), staff member with the UN Secretariat in New York and Geneva (1983-95), chair of the expert meetings that drafted the OSCE Lund Recommendations on the Effective Participation of National Minorities in Public Life (1999), Chairman/Rapporteur of the UN

Working Group on Minorities (2006), and a member of the UN Sub-Commission for the Promotion and Protection of Human Rights (2004-06).

He is Editor-in-Chief of the Yearbook of Polar Law (with Timo Koivurova) and of the International Journal on Minority and Group Rights and Co-Editor of the Nordic Journal of International Law. He has edited several books and is the author of more than 200 scholarly articles in books and journals and several reports for global and regional organizations.

Dr. Claire Methven O'Brien is a Baxter Fellow and Lecturer in Law at the School of Law of the University of Dundee, Scotland. She is also a Senior Researcher at the <u>Danish Institute for Human Rights</u>, Copenhagen, and a Global Practitioner attached to the University of Strathclyde Business School's MBA Programmes. She is also an Honorary Lecturer in the School of Management at the University of St. Andrews, Scotland.

Since joining the University of Dundee in 2020, Claire has established the <u>LLM Business and Human Rights</u>, the first such course worldwide.

Claire has twenty years' experience of advising governments, international businesses, international development agencies, financial institutions, and human rights organisations on human rights and business and human rights matters.

Claire holds a PhD from the <u>European University Institute</u>, <u>Florence</u>, and other degrees from <u>Queens'</u> <u>College</u>, <u>University of Cambridge</u>, the <u>London School of Economics and Political Science</u> and <u>City</u>, <u>University London</u>. Claire is a Barrister called to the London Bar and a member of the <u>Middle Temple</u>.

She has been a Research Fellow at the <u>Centre for the Study of Human Rights of the London School of Economics and Political Science</u>, and held visiting positions at the <u>University of Groningen Department for International Law</u> and <u>New York University School of Law</u>.

Claire's publications include the Council of Europe's <u>Business and human rights</u>. <u>A Handbook for Legal Practitioners</u>, <u>Public procurement and human rights</u>: <u>Opportunities</u>, <u>Risks and Dilemmas for the State as Buyer</u>.

She has twenty years' experience of advising governments, international businesses, international development agencies, financial institutions, and human rights organisations on business and human rights matters. Peter Muchlinski is Emeritus Professor of International Commercial Law at the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), University of London. He has been a door tenant at Brick Court Chambers, London, since 1990 https://www.brickcourt.co.uk/our-people/profile/professor-peter-muchlinski.

Prior to joining SOAS he was Professor of Law and International Business at Kent Law School, University of Kent (2001-5) and was the Draper's Professor of Law in the Law Department of Queen Mary,

University of London, from 1998 to 2001. He was a Lecturer in Law at Kent Law School between 1981 and 1983 and then at the London School of Economics (LSE) from 1983 to 1996. In 1996 he was promoted to Senior Lecturer and remained at the LSE until his first professorial appointment in 1998 to Queen Mary.

He specialises in the regulation of multinational enterprises, international investment law and business and human rights having published numerous articles, book chapters and papers in these areas. He is the author of *Multinational Enterprises and the Law* (Third edition, Oxford University Press, 2021) and co-editor (with Dr Federico Ortino and Professor Christoph Schreuer) of the *Oxford Handbook of International Investment Law* (Oxford University Press, 2008) to which he also contributed three chapters. He has co-edited (with Julia Black and Paul Walker) *Commercial Regulation and Judicial Review* (Hart Publishing, 1998). He has recently completed a new introductory book on business and human rights entitled *Advanced Introduction to Business and Human Rights* (Edward Elgar Publishing, forthcoming July 2022).

He acted as a principal legal adviser to the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) on investment issues for fourteen years between 1997 and 2012. During the period of June-October 2003 he was on leave of absence from Kent Law School and worked at UNCTAD in Geneva as a Senior Legal Expert in the Division on Investment Technology and Enterprise Development (now the Division on Investment and Enterprise). He was, until its dissolution in August 2008, Co-Rapporteur to the International Law Association Committee on the International Law on Foreign Investment. He acted as Adviser to the International Commission of Jurists Expert Panel on Corporate Complicity in International Crimes between 2006-2008.
